## 2 Admission period

This screening process applies to applicants applying for admission in October 2026 and April 2027. Examinations are held in late August or late February.

## 3 Eligibility for Application

**The applicant must have a nationality other than Japanese and be residing in Japan at the time of application. In addition, at least one of the following points must apply to the applicant.**

**※ Applicants wishing to begin in April 2027 should replace “September 2026” with “March 2027”.**

- (1) The applicant has graduated (or will have graduated by September 2026) from a Japanese university.
- (2) The applicant has received (or will have received by September 2026) a Bachelor’s degree from NIAD-QE (National Institution for Academic Degrees and Quality Enhancement of Higher Education).
- (3) The applicant has completed (or will have completed by September 2026), 16 years of formal education in an overseas country.
- (4) The applicant has completed (or will have completed by September 2026), a correspondence course of study for 16 years from an applicable school overseas in subjects that are equivalent to those taken in a Japanese school.
- (5) The applicant has completed (or will have completed by September 2026), a course of study for 16 years at a university that has been ranked and has been designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Science and Technology - Japan.
- (6) The applicant has completed (or will have completed by September 2026), a special course in a vocational school (limited to schools with a course term of 4 years or more and which meet the standards established by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology - Japan.)
- (7) The applicant will fulfill at least one of the conditions below by September 2026:
  - a. Been enrolled in a university for three or more years.
  - b. Completed 15 years of formal education in an overseas country.
  - c. Completed 15 years of formal education through correspondence classes which were taken in Japan from an overseas school.
  - d. Has studied at a university that has been ranked and has been designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Science and Technology - Japan. (This is limited to applicants who have completed 15 years of formal education in an overseas country)
- (8) The applicant has been individually screened for admission eligibility by this institution’s graduate school and has been deemed to have an equivalent or greater academic ability to that of a person with a university graduation. The applicant must also have reached the age of 22 by September 2026.

Note : It is necessary for applicants who are applying under eligibility rules (7) or (8) to be screened in advance in order to determine their eligibility, so they will need to complete the 「入学試験出願資格審査調書」 (Nyuugaku shiken shutsugan shikaku shinsa chousho) . Applicants must attach a document about their research activities, as well as a copy of their graduation certificate and academic transcripts. These documents must be sent to the Admissions Department by the following dates.

(C) Screening fee: 30,000 JPY	The details can be confirmed in (5) How to Pay for the Screening Fee below.  Please submit the credit card payment confirmation email or a copy of the payment slip along with the application documents. The original should be retained by the applicant.  [For Japanese Government Scholarship students] The Screening fee is unnecessary. Instead of the transfer payment certificate, a certificate of government-sponsored foreign student (free format) should be submitted (prepared by the school you are enrolled in).
(D) Return Address Card (Form C)	This card will be used to send an acceptance letter and other documents for the admission procedure, so be sure to write the same name and address in all of the columns.
(E) Academic Transcripts	This should be drawn up by the president of the school last attended, and should be submitted in a sealed envelope. Applicants who graduated, or who are to graduate, from Muroran IT do not need to submit this document.

<p>(F) Certificate of Graduation or Certificate of Projected Graduation (Original or Certified Copy)</p>	<p>The certificate of graduation should be drawn up by the president of the university last attended. (A certificate with the same contents as the original issued by a public agency is also acceptable). <p>(I) TOEIC Official score Certificate or TOEIC IP Score Report</p>	<p>(Only for those applicants who choose English as a Common Course and wish to use their score from a TOEIC Test taken in advance.) The score must have been obtained after May 2025.</p> <p>○In the case of the TOEIC IP Test Please submit the original "Score Report (Individual Score Sheet)".</p> <p>○In case of TOEIC Public Test Please submit the original OFFICIAL SCORE CERTIFICATE. Please Note: The Application Form (Form A) and the Photograph Card (Form B) only be printed out after all the relevant information has been entered into the Web Application System.
- II. All documents must be written in Japanese or English. If the original document is written in another language, a Japanese or English translation must be attached.
- III. The application documents must be written in Japanese. Among them, those prepared by foreign schools or institutions must have Japanese or English translations attached.
- IV. According to the guidelines for implementing the Japanese Government MEXT Scholarship (Ministry of Education ruling on March 31, 1954), foreign students with a Japanese Government scholarship, as well as foreign students sponsored by the Japanese Government may submit the negotiation documents for their scholarship and sponsorship in place of items (F) and (G).
- V. Incomplete application documents will not be accepted.
- VI. The academic advisor you desire may not be available due to reasons such as retirement, so please confirm their availability on our official website.
- VII. Before going through application procedures, the applicant should seek the advice of his or her desired supervisor for the contents of education/study, etc. this can be done online via Microsoft Teams, by phone, or in a face-to-face meeting.(In order to ensure smooth communication with the desired supervisor, e-mail-only consultations are not acceptable.)
- VIII. If any false statements or forgeries are found within the submitted documents, or if there is any evidence of cheating during the exam, the applicant's acceptance or admission may be revoked.

<TOEIC Score Conversion Method>

If Applicants select "English" as the Examination language, their TOEIC score will be converted into an English score.

A TOEIC Score of 590 or more: The English Score = 200 points

A TOEIC score between 220 and 590: The English Score =  $0.5 \times$  The TOEIC Score - 95 points  
(eg. a TOEIC score of 470 points will be converted into an English score of 140 points)

A TOEIC Score below 220: The English Score = 15 points

- I. The date and time of announcement of the screening results is provisional and subject to change. Such change will be announced on the Muroran IT website.
- II. Muroran IT will not answer any inquiry about screening results by phone or e-mail.
- III. An acceptance letter will be sent on the day of announcement of the screening results; it is not meant to arrive on the day of announcement of the screening results.

## 11 Points to Keep in Mind When Applying

- (1) Muroran Institute of Technology is a national institute.
- (2) The Master's course is a two-year course. A degree will be awarded to those who have earned the required credits, submitted a research thesis and passed the oral defense of the thesis. Students can proceed to a three-year Doctoral Course after finishing a Master's Course.
- (3) For October 2023 Admissions, the academic year begins in October, and ends in September of the next year, the first semester runs from October to March, and the second from April to September. For April 2024 admissions, the academic year begins in April, and ends in March of the next year, the first semester runs from April to September, and the second from October to March.
- (4) All classes will be conducted in either Japanese or English, so sufficient Japanese or English language skills are required.
- (5) Applicants are advised to consult with a faculty member to ensure that there is an appropriate faculty advisor to assist the applicant with his or her particular subject of research.
- (6) Dormitory for Foreign Students: Upon selection by the Institute, a limited number of students are permitted to live in the dormitory for one year only, if space is available.

## VI Enrollment Procedures

Once the applicant has been informed of his acceptance, the following documents must be brought in within the specified period to complete the enrollment process.

However, if the applicant is unable to bring the documents in person, they may be submitted all at once by registered mail (within the prescribed enrollment period).

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### \* Points to keep in mind concerning enrollment procedures

I. Students who wish to decline their enrollment should contact the Admission Office by telephone, stating their intention to decline.

Note : Students who do not complete the enrollment procedures during the enrollment period will be considered as having declined enrollment.

II. Students who have completed the enrollment procedures, but would like to decline enrollment, must do so by the following dates: October 2026 students must do so by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 30, 2026, and April 2027 students must do so by 5:00p.m. on Wednesday, March 31, 2027.

III. Students who have completed the enrollment procedures, but who decline enrollment after the period stated in article II will be treated as a withdrawing student.

IV. Under no circumstances will the entrance fee be returned.

V. Detailed information about the necessary documents, as well as the amount and payment method of the entrance fee and tuition fees, will be included in the enrollment information to be sent after the announcement of the successful candidates (early in February 2027).

VI. The entrance fee and tuition listed above are the projected amounts. If these fees are revised at the time of admission or while a student is in attendance, the student will be charged the revised fees and/or tuition.

- VII. Students with a Japanese Government Scholarship will not be required to pay the entrance fee or tuition.
